Just a Few Thoughts.....by Dennis Murakami

I pride myself on the fact that I am welcomed to play with many groups. The primary reason is because they recognize an easy pigeon. The other reason, I believe, is due to a conscious effort to practice good golf etiquette and courtesy. Golf etiquette and courtesy can go a long way in improving enjoyment of the game. Here are some of the things I practice.

1. Show up on time. I like to show up a little early

especially if someone else has made the tee time. Showing up on time to check in and pay my green fees goes a long way in easing tensions with my playing foursome.

2. Fix your ball marks on the greens. This is just common courtesy for the players behind me. If I can, I'll try to fix my playing partner's ball marks also. They'll appreciate the gesture.

3. Replace your fairway divots with the divot or sand

provided with the cart. I can't tell you how many bogeys and double bogeys I have suffered and all the appropriate expletives that go with them because of someone else's divots.

4. Rake the bunkers after your sand shot. I try to leave the bunker in better condition than how I found it. Raking bunkers doesn't mean just getting rid of footprints and your explosion shot. It means

leveling out the sand so that there aren't any uneven mounds that may make a bunker shot more difficult.

5. Keep talking to a minimum while someone is on the tee. I try to keep quiet while my playing partners are on the tee. Also, if someone is on the tee I never take practice swings if I may be within their peripheral view. The game is hard enough without all those distractions.

6. If I hit into an adjacent fairway with a foursome on the tee ready to hit, I will wait until they have teed off before taking my shot. Driving my cart into the middle of another group's fairway is not only rude; it's also dangerous.

7. If my playing companion's ball goes astray, I'll try to help them

locate their ball. This is not only courteous but also helps speed up play.

8. Don't step on someone's putting line. With the advent of softspikes this becomes less of an issue but it still displays courtesy for my playing partners. In a related matter, don't drag your feet on the green and leave marks. These can be worse than spike marks.

9. If I am closest to the hole when everyone is ready to putt I will tend the flag. I never assume that everyone can see the hole and automatically pull the flag. Once I do pull the flag out, I try not to lay it in a position where a putt may accidentally hit it.

10. If I think there is a chance a shot may hit someone I will yell fore even if I did not hit the shot. Sometimes the person hitting the shot doesn't realize where the ball is going and may not realize it is heading for someone else.

11. If I'm driving the cart I'll be careful when driving down steep hills with sharp curves. Once I was driving too fast down a hill and made too sharp a turn. My playing partner went rolling out of the cart. Good thing we were on soft grass.

12. Have fun. I have never taken my game so seriously that my partners have regretted playing with me. Hitting a shot out of bounds or in the water or taking a 15 on a par 5 may make you angry but don't let it affect others and don't take your anger out on them. Remember that it's only a **GAME**.

Practice these etiquette tips and you'll find yourself welcomed by any group and on any course at any time.
