# Know The Rules For Bunker Play......

The following are some basic rules to remember when playing a ball in the bunker. Some important definitions are required. The definition of a "hazard" is any bunker or water hazard. "Loose Impediments" are natural objects such as leaves, twigs, stones, branches, etc. Sand and

"loose loose soil are impediments" on the putting green, but not elsewhere.

Here are some common situations that you may encounter in a bunker:

# **Loose Impediments**

Rule 13-4 does not allow

you to remove loose impediments in a bunker. When you have a trig or leaves on your ball, play the ball as it lies. There is an exception. If your ball is under leaves and you cannot visibly see the ball from any angle, you may remove the leaf or

leaves so that **only a part of the ball** is visible. It may not be at an angle that is visible when taking your stance. A player is not necessarily entitled to see his ball when playing a stroke.

#### **Movable Obstructions**

You may remove movable obstructions such as a rake cigarette/cigar butt, can, cup, etc. from a bunker. If your ball comes to rest on a movable obstruction such as a rake, you may remove the rake. If the ball moves, replace the ball to its original spot. You're not allowed to press the ball into the sand when replacing the ball to its original position. You are allowed to place a rake in the bunker prior to playing a stroke as long as you do not test the hazard.

# <u>Practice Swings and</u> <u>Backswing</u>

You are allowed to take practice swings near your ball. You take several practice swings in a bunker, touching the ground each time. You incurred only a two-stroke penalty for breach of Rule 13-4 and USGA Decision 13-4/3. You do not incur a two-stroke penalty for each

practice swing. You touched sand or a loose impediment during your backswing in a hazard, you incurred a two-stroke penalty for breach of Rule 13-4.

## <u>Ball Buried, Wrong Ball,</u> <u>and Lost Ball</u>

If your ball is half-buried and you can't identify it as your ball, what do you do? Touch it or rotate the ball. you incurred a 1-stroke penalty. You play the ball as it lies; there is no penalty for playing a wrong ball in the hazard. If your ball is buried in a bunker, you may use a club or a rake to search for it. If your ball was fully buried in the sand, the ball shall be recovered with sand so that only a part of the ball is If your ball is visible. moved while searching for it, the ball shall be replaced and no penalty is incurred. If you lose your ball in the bunker, you incurred a 1stroke penalty and must play a ball at the spot from which the original ball was last played.

# <u>Unplayable Ball and</u> <u>Casual Water</u>

When declaring an unplayable ball in a bunker, there are three options: 1) drop a ball within

2 club-lengths of the spot where the ball lay, but not nearer the hole and the ball must be dropped in the bunker: 2) drop a ball behind the point where the ball lay, keeping that point directly between the hole and the spot on which the ball is dropped, with no limit to how far behind that point the ball may be dropped except the ball must be dropped in the bunker; and 3) play a ball at the spot from which the original ball was last played. When your ball lies in casual water in a bunker, determine nearest point of relief and drop the ball within 1 club length no nearer the hole. The ball must be dropped in the bunker.

## Miscellaneous

It's your privilege to touch the ground in removing an obstruction and in a hazard in order to prevent a fall. When a competitor's ball and your ball are both in the bunker near each other and his stroke causes the sand to move your ball, what are your options? You may request the competitor to rake the bunker and you must recreate the original lie to replace your ball to its original position.
