## **Challenge Corner**

It proved to be a very exciting day for the 3rd round of the Survivor Tournament held at San Dimas Canyon GC. The final four teams consisted of Jerry Chang/Alex Wong vs James Nelson/Roger Law and Bryan Inoue/Howard Wu vs Chris Olson/James Rose.

The format was alternate player scoring which meant that a different player was responsible for a designated hole. That player's score would count as the team score. The team with the lowest score was the winner of the match.

The first match of Chang/Wong and Nelson/Law proved to be very exciting. Chang/Wong took an early 2 stroke lead through 3 holes. However, on the 4th hole the team of Nelson/Law decided to use their mulligan (An option whereby a team can flip.flop their chosen scores. They can thank Co-Coordinator Larry Taylor for that idea) an turned a 2 stroke deficit into a 1 stroke lead. From there the team of Nelson/Law maintained a small lead until the 13th hole when Chang/Wong pulled even. It was all even until the 16th hole when Alex Wong hit the shot of the day on the potentially disastrous par 3 over water. Alex struck his shot about 10 feet from the cup and proceeded to make a net birdie. After the 17th hole Chang/Wong held on to a slim one shot lead with the difficult 372 yard par 4 coming up. Jim Nelson played the hole wonderfully with a par 4. Alex Wong again came through with a clutch 10 foot putt for par and the team of Chang/Wong finished with a narrow one stroke lead 74 to 75.

The second match was the team of Bryan Inoue and Howard Wu vs Chris Olson and James Rose. Inoue/Wu took an early 3 stroke lead through 5 holes but Olson/Rose played steadily and took advantage of bad timing on the part of Inoue/Wu and retook a 2 stroke lead after 9 holes. Inoue/Wu tenaciously fought back and pulled even after 12 holes. It was then the team of Olson/Rose kicked their games into overdrive and pulled steadily away and finished with a comfortable 9 stroke lead 69 to 78. The final and consolation matches are scheduled to take place in September tentatively at Sierra Lakes GC in Fontana.

to post your score after each round you play to ensure an accurate handicap index.
