Just a Few Thoughts on...Fast Play.....Dennis Murakami

I decided to "rush" this article out before we play Westridge. After you play the course you'll better understand why I wrote this.

Everyone who plays the game of golf hates slow play. But, have you ever given any thought that you may be the slow player? Have you ever seen these warning signs:

- 1. After you complete a round the other players in back of you have really nasty looks when they pass you.
- 2. Golf balls suddenly appear out of nowhere while you're standing in the fairway deciding whether to hit the 3 or 5 wood from 260 yards out.
- 3. You find yourself getting later and later tee times in your tournaments.

Okay, so maybe we could all learn to play a little faster. But there are really very few pieces of advice given to encourage "fast" play. "Hit when ready", "Putt out", or my favorite – "If it's within leather, pick it up". (I'll never say that to Howard Wu). These are all gems but I think there are a few more steps we can take to encourage fast play. First you need to think about playing a quick round. It all starts with attitude. Have a little courtesy for the group behind you.

Do you and your friends all drive the ball in the fairway everytime? No? Well then take lessons. But until then you should be watching your ball off the tee. You should be watching your playing partner's ball off the tee. Use some sort of landmark like a tree or a bush to gauge where to start looking. If there is a chance you or your playing partner's ball may be lost or out of bounds, then hit a provisional. There's nothing more embarrassing than making a long trip back to the tee to face an irritated foursome.

Do your playing partners cheat? No? Then why are you waiting and watching your cart partner hit his ball when you could be walking or driving to your ball and preparing to hit yourself. You can do that and still keep an eye out on his or her shot while you get ready to hit your ball. (**Cont. on page 4**)

Well let me say that an over indulgence of etiquette is one of the primary reasons for slow play. Take enough clubs to cover the situation. One of my favorite playing

partners is Linda Donato. Linda will always take about 4 or 5 clubs to cover any situation. She knows what she wants to do and executes quickly. People could learn an awful lot by watching how fast she plays. Leave the lessons on the driving range. Some people are mechanical in their approach. Especially people who have recently taken golf lessons. The golf swing is too complicated and fast to think about all the components. Take one or two thoughts at the most and swing loose and

easy. I think you'll like the results. I hope this article gets you thinking about whether you could play faster and still enjoy the game. No one likes to be rushed but at the same time we all need to play courteously. If you do find your group falling behind and you're having problems, think about allowing the group in back to play through. They'll appreciate it and you may find that they'll actually smile at you when you get back to the clubhouse.
