Here's a ruling that Billy Bob 1. Inform the player that he and I argued over many times and it was never resolved until we both researched it in the Decisions on the Rules of Golf. Here's the scenario. A player plays his first shot off the tee and is unable to find his ball, drops another ball in the area where his original ball was lost and plays that ball. What is the ruling in stroke play?

Most of us would probably apply one of the following rulings:

- cannot proceed to play the dropped ball and must return to the tee box and hit another ball. Player is hitting 3.
- 2. Impose a 2 stroke penalty. Player is hitting 4.
- 3. DQ (Disqualify) the player for playing the dropped ball. Player doesn't have to hit anymore.

The correct ruling is none of the above. In stroke play, the

player incurs the strokeand-distance penalty (Rule 27-1) and an additional penalty of two strokes for a breach of that Rule. That's a 3 stroke penalty! If the breach was a "serious breach" of the rule. The player must rectify the error under the definition "serious Breach"; otherwise the player is DQ! A "serious breach"

Just a Few Thoughts...On Excuses.....Dennis Murakami

(In the last issue of The Eagle I discussed 6 Academy Award winning ways to justify any golf situation. This time I would like to propose 7 more ways to play bad golf and blame it entirely on someone else.)

Have you ever hit a shot that was so bad that you had to blame something else to indicate it wasn't entirely **your** fault? Well here are a few tips that I've observed (and tried) over the years. Be aware that in order to pull some of these off you'll need Academy A w a r d w i n n i n g performances.

Situation #9: You're 100 yards from the green. You hit a miserable pitching wedge that lands 40 yards right of the green.

Remedy: Immediately look at the bottom of your left shoe. Brush away any excess dirt or grass. Tighten up your spikes so as to give the impression that you accidentally slipped when you hit the shot.

Situation #10: You're 100 yards from the green. You skull a pitching wedge 30 yards past the green.

Remedy: This one takes Lawrence Olivier Acting to pull off. Immediately look at the back of your club pretending to check that it's the right one. Look around the ground and pretend to look at the 100-yard marker. Then with the sincerity of William Jefferson Clinton, exclaim loudly "I don't think these yardage markers are

right!"

Situation #11: You're in the middle of the fairway. You pull out a 3-wood out. You hit a terrible shot that goes 70 yards if you're lucky.

Remedy: Make sure no one is close by: Curse out loudly that people should replace their %&*\$ divots in the fairway. Rudely throw your club back into your bag. For an academy award finishing move, go to the cart and pull out the sand bottle; stomp back over to the proximity of where your shot was and make yourself useful by filling in a real divot.

Situation #13: You've just left your 5-foot putt birdie putt 1 foot short.

Local Rules for the Cascades Tournament.....By Don Stephens

Special attention should be paid to the observance of "**The Cascades**" local rules.

They are as follows:

- 1. Out of bounds defined by white stakes, marked paths and boundary fences.
- 2. Water hazards- defined by

yellow stakes.

- 3. Lateral water hazards- defined by red stakes.
- 4. Players get free relief (without incurring a penalty stroke) from: cart paths, staked trees, immovable obstructions, newly planted areas and french drains.

5. Ball striking power lines must be replayed- without penalty.

As always please practice proper etiquette by repairing ball marks, keeping carts on paths near trees and greens and play ready golf.

has occurred when a player proceeds otherwise than in accordance with the Rules and, in the opinion of the Rule Committee, either gains a significant advantage or negotiates a significant distance without making a stroke.

Here is an example of a "serious breach" for the above scenario. A player plays his first shot on a 410 yards, Par 4 hole, and loses his ball. No one in the foursome saw where the ball went. The player elects not to re-tee and drops a ball in the fairway at the 100 yard mark. Has the player negotiated a significant distance without making a stroke and also gain a significant advantage by

dropping in the fairway? For expediency of play, you are allow to use the above ruling by taking a 3 stroke penalty. With this ruling, the player is hitting 5. Keep in mind that it's always more advantageous to play that provisional ball initially or return to the tee box to play another ball. With this option, the player is only hitting 3.
