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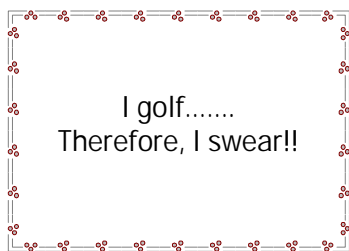

In the early 1990s, as the IRS ended new employee hiring and the LA IRS softball league players began to age, he had a vision of what could take IRS employee camaraderie to the next level - an LA IRS golf league. At the beginning there was less than 30 players in friendly matches sporadically held throughout the year using the Callaway scoring system, mulligans, and games such as best ball and better ball team play.

He acted as tournament director, newsletter editor, membership chairman, treasurer, scorekeeper, and any other job that needed to be done; sometimes all at one time!! Of course, at this time there were no official positions, just a need for someone with enthusiasm and dedication to get things organized and running. By the mid-1990s, interest grew both in



numbers and the desire to establish handicaps and have individual play. He felt it was time to take the next step and ask for accreditation as an Affiliate club of the SCGA. The club received accreditation, as the ALSRI Golf Club, and he became its first President.

Now he had to deal with a fast-growing membership, establishing books and records for a new taxable entity, the need to run more tournaments, and establishing guidelines and an official board to help him run this new official organization.

He continued to be the President during first few years of the new affiliate. But he didn't stop there; he continued to act in whatever capacity was needed to ensure that players enjoyed their tournament round; although it was transparent, and sometimes taken for

Challenge Corner

PRIMM VALLEY TOURNAMENT IS A FIRST CLASS EVENT

After not participating in Primm I and II, I figured it was time to participate in Primm III. After all, the price was right and individual rooms were now available to bring family along.

On Sunday my family and I were able to "case the joint", relax in our room, and enjoy a leisurely meal before gearing up for the big tournament on Monday and Tuesday. My 18 year old son loved our timing; when we arrived at the Primmadonna to check-in, the winners of the Miss Nevada Hawaiian Tropic contest were lining up in front of the hotel for publicity pictures. Upon entering the hotel to register, I got in line behind 2 golfers who had just returned from the Primm Valley golf course-- Larry and Archie had just finished a practice round teeing off at high noon in the desert sun!

On Monday I arrived at the course to find my name on a list with the security guard, my cart waiting for me in the parking lot, and a friendly staff to assist me with my bag before I went to the driving range filled with complimentary range balls. The carts all had the players names already printed on the front, ice chests with complimentary bottled water, and wet towels for each player. The temperatures was only about 106-108 degrees (I say only, because of course it was 100-102 degrees in the LA valleys). There was ice cold, fresh water stations located at the tee every 3 holes on both courses to refill your bottled water.

We teed off on time (I was in the last group on Monday) on the Desert course, and the course was in excellent condition. The landing areas were tight and the greens hard and fast--a true test for most of any golfers arsenal. At the end of the round, the staff cleaned our clubs, cleaned the carts, and left our clubs on the cart for the round the next morning (no need to pack, haul, and unpack clubs!!). Even though our group did not finish the 16th-18th holes due to lightening and rain, the club (after negotiations by V2) allowed us to show up early the next morning to complete the round.

We again teed off on time on Tuesday, at the Lakes course (we finished the Desert course in time to start as the first group). This course was a little more forgiving off the tee than the Desert course, but the putting was still challenging. The temperature was even lower Tuesday than on Monday!! The clubhouse was immaculate, and the restrooms were fully stocked with real towels, lockers, showers, and toiletries.

In research done by Golf Digest of over 6,000 semi-private and public courses, The Primm Valley Golf Club is rated 2nd best in service and 3rd best in course conditions. I sure would like to play the ones that are ahead of them!!

I will not bore you with details about the actual scores, winners, etc. as I am sure that will be the subject of another article in this or the next newsletter. I am very glad I went to Primm III and whole-heartedly recommend that our entire membership strongly consider participating in Primm IV next year. It is well worth the price.
