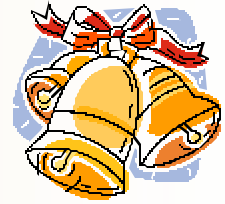

# Slow Play

## SLOW PLAY

Rules of Golf provide a penalty for breach of Rule 6-7 – Undue Delay and Slow Play. The rule states, “In stroke play only, the Committee may, in such a condition, modify the penalty for a breach of this Rule as follows:

First offense — One stroke;

Second offense — Two strokes.

For subsequent offense — Disqualification.”

Playing a round of 18 holes on the average takes 4 ½ hours. This averages 15 minutes per hole. Golfers routinely play a round of golf under 4 hours or less. Players in ALSRI tournaments and non-ALSRI tournaments generally take 5 to 6 hours to complete. When players finish a tournament in 5 hours or less, it’s a round the club finds acceptable. The players in the ALSRI tournament should be able to complete a round of golf in 4 ½ hours or less but it’s not going to happen unless the players become cognizant of their slow play.

Slow play refers to a group that has fallen behind the group in front of them by a hole or more. Even experienced golfers are guilty of slow play and at times, these players will be totally oblivious or in denial of being slow. A marshal will often confront a group of players and courteously request the players to speed up play. On rare occasions, a marshal will sound abusive and offensive when instructing a group of players to speed up play. Regardless, the central issue is slow play.

The club’s practice is to schedule the “rabbits’ with early tee times. The club also accommodates special requests for early tee times or later tee times. Pairings of slow players by the club with early tee times were mistakenly allowed and scheduled in the past. As a result, the club’s plumbing was backed up severely.

The key to avoiding slow play is to keep pace with the group in front of you. The following are recommendations to speed up play:

1. Be ready to putt on the putting green. Mark your ball quickly. While others are in line to putt and reading their green, read your green at this time as long as it doesn’t create a distraction to the putter. Be cognizant when it’s your turn to putt. Attend the flag if your ball is closest to the pin. Leave your bag or cart in such a position that will enable quick movement off the green and towards the next tee. When your group is falling behind, the player(s) who holed out first should go to the next hole to tee off while others in your foursome are putting out. Recording your scores at an inopportune time may contribute to slow play.
2. Be ready to tee off. Birdie and par players need to tee up quickly for their “honors”. When they’re not playing ready golf, dispense with the “honors” when your group is behind. Short ball hitters in the group should be ready to hit off the tee first when the distance between the tee area and the next group allows it. Help your fellow golfer in the foursome by following the ball when he/she tees off. Players sharing a cart should always follow each other’s shot. This is especially helpful when the ball is hit into trees or the rough.
3. Always hit a provisional ball when the ball may be lost or OB. This will save a trip back to the spot where the ball was last played.
4. Golfers sharing a cart always help each other search for their lost balls. Other players in the group should continue their play and help when needed. The Rules of Golf allows only a maximum of 5 minutes to search for a lost ball.
5. Allow the group that is waiting behind you to play through if you’re searching for your ball.
6. A pre-shot routine including the waggle and shake may contribute to slow play. Minimize the number of practice swings or practice putting strokes when it’s your turn to play. Look for freebie lost balls or fish for balls when it doesn’t contribute to slow play.
7. To speed up play, it’s acceptable to have two players hit their balls simultaneously except when on the putting green and teeing area and as long as it doesn’t interfere with each other’s play. You’ll find this situation when one of the players is in a different fairway or in the tree area.
8. On a Par 3, allow the group behind you to play their tee shots after your group has hit onto the green. This practice applies when the group of players on the next hole is still at the tee box waiting or teeing off.
9. When your group is no longer keeping pace with the group in front, notify the players in your group that everyone needs to speed up play.
10. Your ALSRI Golf Club solicits your help in keeping the proper pace of play at all times. Currently, the club has not invoked Rule 6-7 for tournament play and has tabled it for advisement and discussion.
